
FAUNISTICS RECORDS FROM THE CZECH REPUBLIC – 298

Hymenoptera: Formicidae

Lasius carniolicus Mayr, 1861. Bohemia centr., Milovice, Pod Benáteckým vrchem Nature Reserve (5755), 50°14'20.841"N 14°53'0.132"E and 50°14'27.314"N 14°53'31.392"E, 2.vi.2009, 2 workers, O. Čížek et J. Zámečník lgt., P. Pech det. et coll., P. Werner revid. Two workers in two pitfall traps on xerothermous grassland slope in former military training area. Rare and very little known species living in dry biotopes. Distributed from Western Europe to Central and Eastern Asia (Buschinger & Seifert 1997; Seifert 2007). **Temporary social parasitic species, uses *Lasius piliferus* Seifert, 1992, *L. flavus* (Fabricius, 1782) and probably other *Lasius* species as hosts (Buschinger & Seifert 1997). New species for the Czech Republic.**
